Nez Perce National Historical Park Kicks Off Year of the Bird

Join the Great Backyard Bird Count in Spalding on February 16

Do you like birds or would like to learn more about them? Join biologists, ornithologists, and park rangers to identify and count birds at the Spalding picnic area on **February 16**. Experienced birders will be on hand to help conduct the Great Backyard Bird Count from **7AM to NOON**. Visitors of all ages and experience levels are welcome to join this unique and fun opportunity - meet at the Visitor Center.

2018 marks the centennial anniversary of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. To commemorate and honor the protection of birds in North America, the National Geographic Society, Audubon Society and other prominent birding groups have identified 2018 as the "Year of the Bird".

Nez Perce National Historical Park will celebrate this act and the importance of birds throughout the year. The park will host a series of special events, exhibits, and guest speakers with opportunities to learn more about the birds in our area and how they were important to the Nez Perce people. An exhibit will open on Friday, February 23 in the park museum. It will highlight birds in Nez Perce material culture. Artifacts on displays will include beaded items that feature birds and bird feathers from the park's museum collection.

The Spalding visitor center is 12 miles east of Lewiston at 39063 U.S. Highway 95. The visitor center is open daily. Winter hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Summer hours begin Memorial Day and run until the day before Labor Day from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. This is an admission free park. The Nez Perce Women's Writers Institute and the Nez Perce Arts Council are pleased to be hosting the second annual Native American Women's Writers Workshop. The theme this year is to discover new ways to be more inspired to create and enhance our storytelling skills at a higher level. Our panelists will be in charge of leading their respective groups during the breakout sessions. The second annual Native American Women's Writers Workshop will take place on February 17-18, 2018 at the Pi-nee-waus Community Center in Lapwai, Idaho on the Nez Perce reservation.

The goal of this two day workshop is to explore proven methods, of seasoned presenters, on how to improve creativity, productivity, clarity, and storytelling skills. Storytelling and writing are expressions of art, which means it's hard to study precisely and it is hard for most of us to work on our craft consistently enough to create storytelling at a master's level. Each participant will be invited to request a panelist as a weekend mentor to discuss personal work during the breakout sessions and on an individual basis. There will be opportunities for audience participants to tell or read their own material in a safe, supportive and nurturing environment.

We would like to invite Native American women, of all ages, to register today for this free workshop. Join us in a weekend of sisterhood and become inspired to sustain your culture and communities through storytelling. Participants in this workshop will also be eligible to be a contributing author in the next anthology. Registration forms will be available at the workshop.



“Winterize” shoes, boots, and assistive devices

- Attach spikeless ice and snow shoe gripper sole covers to shoes for extra stability when walking on slippery surfaces. Look for these at sporting goods stores.
- Attach an ice gripper cane tip that has spikes on the bottom to penetrate the ice and secure a firm grip. Ice grip tips can be purchased online.
- Choose winter shoes with rubber soles to maintain traction on slippery surfaces.
- Try this inexpensive way to make [wheelchair snow tires](#).

Carry kitty litter for slick surfaces

Encourage older adults to [carry a zip top bag filled with a lightweight kitty litter](#) in their pocket and cast it out ahead of themselves on slick surfaces.

Screen older adults for fall risk

Health care providers: begin to check ALL older adults with the STEADI fall risk screening tool as part of your normal intake and reevaluation process. Learn more about administering the [STEADI screen](#) and using [evidence-based falls prevention programs](#) in your community.

5

Give the gift of falls prevention

Encourage adult children to give fall-proofing gifts to their parents:

- Fall alarm systems that are motion triggered without hitting a button
- Higher toilets in the home
- Replace multifocal glasses with single vision eyeglass lenses
- Grab bars in bathroom and next to outside steps or inside thresholds
- Install firm stair railings on both sides of stairways and set automatic lights over stairways and by outside entrances
- Cover the entryway to the home and provide a table to set down bags while finding keys
- Shorter days mean more time in the dark—give tiny flashlights to attach to keys, hats, and coat buttons




